This package contains the following files:

- Scrivener Poetry Template: a Scrivener project template you can use to house your collection.
- Scrivener Ebook Preset: use this to apply formatting and create a nice, clean ebook.
- MS Word Template: Use for CreateSpace.

SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS

The Scrivener templates were created in OS X, so Mac users should be able to use them with no problem. I can't guarantee that Windows Scrivener users will have the same functionality because the Scrivener Windows version doesn't have all the same features. This may affect how your book looks in its final form.

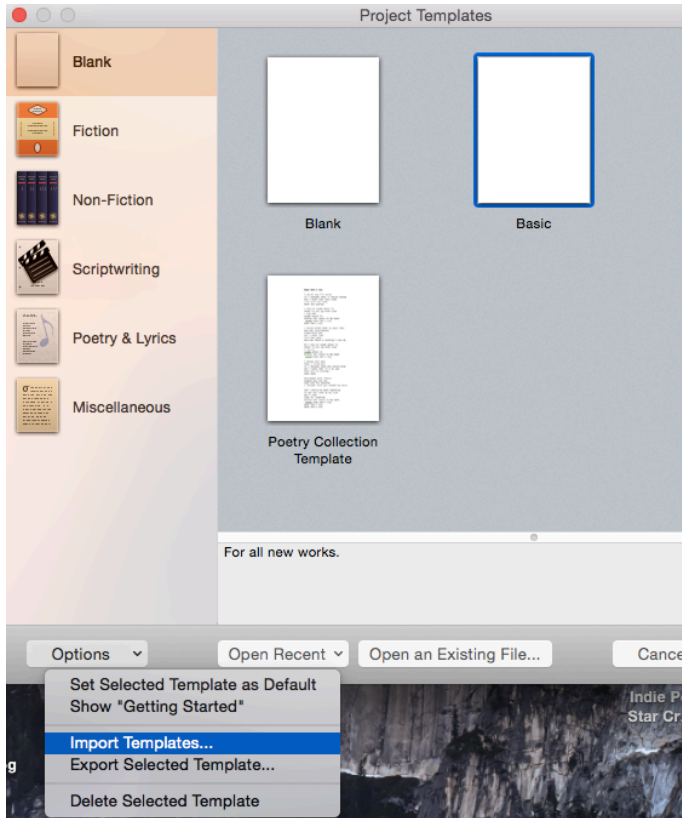
The Microsoft Word templates were created in Windows. They should work on both Windows and OS X, but Apple's version of Word has its own quirky formatting, and in general, I don't recommend it for paperback formatting. I've never had an Apple Word file accepted at CreateSpace—they reject it every time.

I apologize in advance for any systems issues you may have—I really do wish that Scrivener and Word worked identically on both platforms.

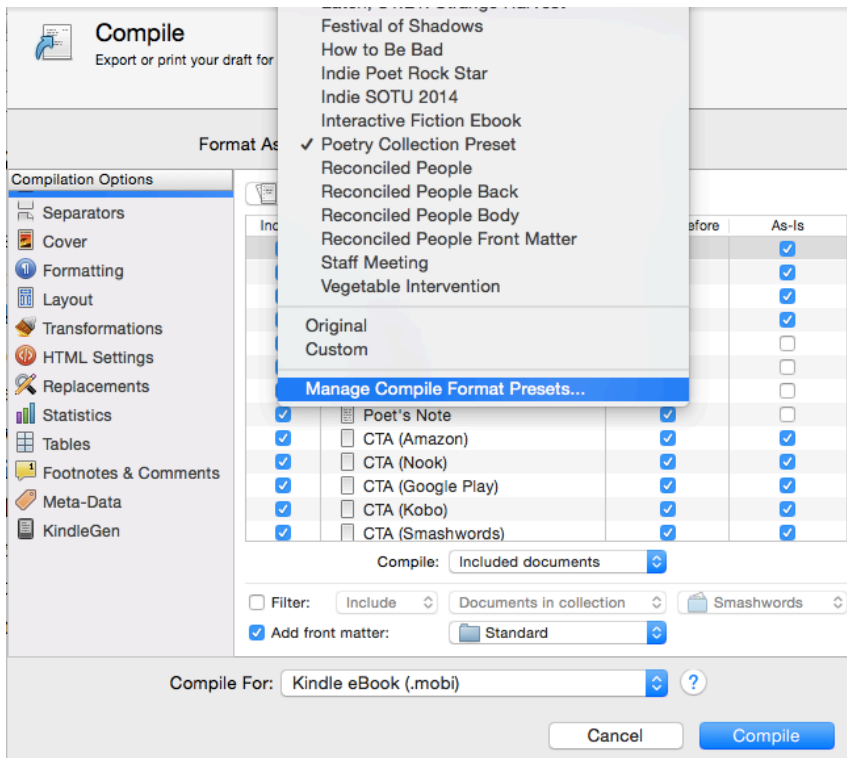
USING THE SCRIVENER POETRY TEMPLATE

To import it, open the Scrivener start-up screen. Under the “Options” bar, select Import templates. You’ll be able to start using it right away.



USING THE SCRIVENER POETRY PRESET

In the Compile screen, in the “Format As” dropdown near the top, select “Manage Compile Presets” at the bottom, and import the preset. It should appear in your preset list. Select it and export to MOBI or EPUB to apply the formatting styles. The preset will give you a clean book that will be accepted for publication at the major retailers, including Smashwords.



USING THE MICROSOFT WORD TEMPLATE

Adjust the settings as you deem necessary. When you're ready for publication, save the file as a PDF.
